FINANCIAL ASSURANCE FOR ROBERTS COUNTY LANDFILL

IT IS HEREBY AGREED between the State of South Dakota, Department of Agriculture and Natural Resources, hereinafter referred to as DANR, and Roberts County, South Dakota, hereinafter referred to as the County, as follows:

WHEREAS, County operates the Roberts County Municipal Solid Waste Landfill as an enterprise fund in compliance with all federal Subtitle D Regulations and State of South Dakota laws and rules; and

WHEREAS, EPA 40 CRF part 258 and the Administrative Rules of South Dakota (ARSD) 74:27:16 establishes financial assurance requirements and mechanisms for local government owners and operators of municipal solid waste landfill facilities; and

WHEREAS, ARSD 74-27-16-05 states the owner or operator may choose one or more of the following mechanisms, to satisfy the provisions of this chapter:

- (1) Trust Fund
- (2) Security bond guaranteeing payment or performance
- (3) Letter of credit
- (4) Insurance; or
- (5) Cash; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the residents of Roberts County to choose cash, as the means to satisfy the provisions of closure/post closure assurance; and NOW, THEREFORE, it is mutually agreed as follows:

County, shall deposit funds in accounts in the joint names of DANR and Roberts County in an amount sufficient to assure performance of the obligations imposed by SDCL 34A-6, inclusive; and

County shall reinvest all interest received on these funds in the accounts in the joint names of the County and DANR; and

All said monies, accounts, and other investments shall be specific on the books and in the documents of County as closure/post closure assets pursuant to the provisions of SDCL 34A-6; and

County shall make withdrawals from the account only after receiving written permission from the Secretary of the DANR, or the Secretary's designee; and

DANR shall have access to the accounts at any time necessary to carry out its obligations under SDCL 34A-6 and upon notification of County and said accounts shall be specified to the County.

This agreement is binding upon the signatories hereto, not as individuals but solely in the capacities as officials of their respective organizations, and acknowledges proper action of the County and DANR to enter the same. Roberts County Solid Waste Landfill.
